- Caroline Promenade: No updates on Promenade design. Arranging a meeting with Chairman Smith/Dr. Muhammad to clarify MPSN role during design development.
- Cap Developments: Ongoing meetings with TXDoT. TXDot has hired consulting company to determine how best to integrate utilities within the caps. They are currently finalizing survey of utilities to determine if they can be integrated into the caps or must be imbedded in a separate bridge.
- Natalia Beard (SWA) reported that they are awaiting utility decisions before proceeding with Caroline Promenade design. Currently surveying trees and esplanades.

Vice President: No report

**Susan Young (Main Street Alliance):** Meeting scheduled for May 16 at St. Paul's Methodist Church to discuss Metro proposed solutions to dangerous intersection Main/Fannin/Sunset. Metro has conducted a two-year study to find ways to enhance safety at those intersections. Current proposal is to close right turns from Sunset onto Fannin. Main Street Alliance will recommend a six-month test of the closure, rather than current proposal to make the closure permanent. Please attend.
