Project has been in process for 2 and ½ years, since January 2017. Re: implementation timeline, on June 11, the Walkable Places Committee approved concept of Walkable Places framework and proposed Transit Corridor amendments. Next step is approval from Planning Commission and then City Council (early 2020). Key concepts have been approved; working with legal department to develop language and funding proposals. Planning Commission will have public meetings. Expected to be presented to City Council in early 2020.

A Walkable Places policy guide will be written.

In 2015, City Council adopted Plan Houston as a general plan to create a common platform with coordinated implementation strategies to guide responsible growth.

Walkable Places and Transit Corridors ordinances are natural outgrowth of Plan Houston.

Muxian described mandatory transit corridors and optional opt-in transit corridors (the latter ordinances adopted in 2009) and their boundaries; and relevance for walkable places concept. Objectives of Walkable Places is to help improve quality of urban place density.

The three pilot areas selected to test this concept are Midtown, Hogan Street in the Near North Side, and Emancipation Avenue in Third Ward.

Extensive discussion and Q & A on these complex issues. Design District designation for Museum Park should be explored.

Muxian and her team were offered to give a tour Museum Park.
